By training, he is a biomedical engineer (with BS from Zhejiang University in China and MS from Rutgers University) and has worked in medical device, consulting, insurance, banking and payment industry close to 30 years. Most notable employers were Siemens Medical Systems, Allstate Insurance and Intuit/Digital Insight. He comes full circle with his career from medical device to IT and back to bioscience with Digital Health as a combination of medical device and IT business.

Ping Fang has connected with a few local entrepreneurship programs. He chaired the inaugural IEEE-BV section Entrepreneurship Program in 2016-17 and helped Startup Ventura County (formerly known as the Startup Weekend Ventura County) for the past 2 years and the current one. He was recognized by the Ventura County of Supervisors and Office of State Assemblywoman Jacqui Erwin for organizing the Inaugural Startup Weekend Ventura County in 2016.
